

s LANDBANK is constantly on the lookout for more innovative products and services to bring to the public, its search is always framed along the Bank's thrust for responsive banking as well as for environmental preservation across demographics and industries.

With the national government's on-going revitalization of the agricultural and transport industries, LANDBANK is doing its share in helping ensure that those in need are given ample support to adapt to these changes.

A new lending facility in compliance with Presidential Directive No. 2018-0176, and in partnership with the Department of Agrarian Reform (DAR) and Department of Agriculture (DA) called Accessible and Sustainable Lending Program for Small Farmers or ASL Farmers Program - aims to help increase the income of small farmers especially the Agrarian Reform Beneficiaries (ARBs). Launched last July 10, 2018, the event coincided with the distribution of certificates of land ownership awards (CLOA) to ARBs in Bayombong, Nueva Vizcaya.

Part of the launch involved DAR Secretary/Atty. John Castriciones and DAR Support Services Office Undersecretary Atty. Emily Padilla receiving the logo of Accessible and Sustainable Lending Program for Small Farmers from LANDBANK Assistant VP for Agrarian Operations Center II Gilbert Barsatan and Head for Nueva Vizcaya Lending Center Ernesto Tumanut (see photo 2).

"We have high hopes for this program which will make credit very accessible to most Filipino farmers at a low interest rate of 6% per annum. This complements LANDBANK's existing agricultural lending programs, as we strive harder to help small farmers increase their productivity and income," said LANDBANK President and CEO Alex Buenaventura.

The program has three lending modules namely:

- To Individual Small Farmers
- Through Agri-based Cooperatives/ Associations

Farmers Cooperatives through Farmers Corporative Inclusive Financing Program

Keeping pace with the government's Public Utility Vehicle Modernization Program, the LANDBANK Support Package for Environment-Friendly and Efficiently-Driven (SPEED) PUVs Program aims to bring commuters safe and reliable public transportation, while allowing drivers and employees of transit companies to engage in inclusive growth opportunities.

In recent months, two companies were able to sign up with LANDBANK to avail of the lending program: PM Jeepney Drivers and Operators Services, Inc. (PMJDOSI) for and 1-Transport Equipment Aggregator and Management, Inc. (1-TEAM). Loan agreements for PMJDOSI and 1-TEAM amounted to P105 million a P43 million, respectively.

Leading the signing were LANDBANK President Buenaventura and PMJDOSI President Roberto Martin, who was accompanied by other PMJDOSI executives that included Administration Vice President Joseph Martin, Secretary General Raul Raquid, Treasurer Domingo Rivera, and Operations Vice President Romula Semillano. President Buenaventura also led the signing and welcome for 1-TEAM President Yuri Sarmiento, as joined by Corporate Secretary Hershel Lyn Calpo (see photo 3).

They are joined by other LANDBANK official, including Executive VP for Agricultural and Development Lending Sector Joselito Gutierrez, First Vice President for Retail and Mid-Market Lending Group Lolita Silva, and Assistant Vice President for Small and Medium Enterprises-Mid-Market Lending Department I Joji Flores. SME-MLD I Account Officer Joshua Agner was also on hand for the event (see photo 1).

Meanwhile, with the continuous rise of fuel prices in the market, public utility jeepney operators and owners can find some relief with the Pantawid Pasada Program (PPP). With the signing of the Joint Memorandum Circular covering general guidelines of implementing agencies last July 2018, a total of 179,852 legitimate PUJ units are expected to benefit from the PPP for two years, from 2018 to 2019.

As a partner financial institution of the PPP, the Bank shall provide its banking services through the issuance of LANDBANK Cash Cards, also called Pantawid Pasada Card (PPC), to the legitimate PUJ Franchise holders/operators. The first 10,000 legitimate PUJ operators have been issued PPCs, each with P5,000 worth of fuel subsidy for 2018. The fuel subsidy shall further improve to P20,514.92 per PUJ unit in 2019.

LANDBANK President Buenaventura answered questions during signing event along with DOT Undersecretary Thomas Orbos, LTO Assistant Sec.. Edgar Galvante, Congressman Dakila Carlo Cua of Quirino Province, LTFRB Chairman Atty. Martin Delgra III, and Department of Finance Director Mark David Ablang (see photo 4).

LANDBANK, together with LTFRB, distributed PPCs to PUJ Franchise holders/operators last July 17 and 18 after the signing. This was held at the Land Transportation Office on East Avenue, Quezon City. The PPC can only be used for fuel purchases.

The use of the card for other purposes will result to the cancellation from the program.

A total of 139,706 cards are available for distribution (as of September 17, 2018).

rior to the awarding ceremonies for the various Recognition Programs of LANDBANK for 2018 that traditionally marks the anniversary celebrations for LANDBANK, members of the Gawad sa Pinakatanging Kooperatiba (PITAK) Board of Judges (BOJ) and Final Screening Committees (FSCs) concluded deliberations to determine the winners of the following programs: Gawad PITAK, Gawad Small and Medium Enterprises (Gawad SME); Gawad Kaagapay; and Gawad Countryside Financial Institutions (Gawad CFI).

The conferment of awards to the winners was held on August 8, 2018 (please see story on page 9), proving to be one of the highlights of LANDBANK's 55th anniversary. For the Gawad PITAK, leading the forum were Senator Juan Miguel Zubiri and Congressman Rico Geron, serving as this year's BOJ Chairperson and Co-Chairperson, respectively. Senator Zubiri heads the Senate Committee on Cooperatives, while Congressman Geron chairs the House Committee on Cooperatives Development.

Held last July 26, 2018 at the Board Room of the LANDBANK Plaza, the event follows the conclusion of the field validation of contenders by internal and external BOJ technical representatives.

Other members of the Gawad PITAK BOJ are LANDBANK President and CEO Alex Buenaventura (as Vice Chairperson), and members Secretary John Castriciones, Department of Agrarian Reform, represented by Director Susana Leones; Secretary Emmanuel Piñol, Department of Agriculture, represented by Assistant Secretary Lerey Panes; Officer-in-Charge/Chairman Benjie Oliva, and Cooperative Development Authority (CDA), represented by Atty. Mona Liza Arriba-Juarez.

Also present during the deliberation were members of the Gawad PITAK Program Management Committee led by LANDBANK Executive VP for Agricultural and Development Lending Sector (ADLS) Joselito Gutierrez. He also serves as the Chairperson of the Final Screening Committees for the Gawad SME, Kaagapay, and CFI, deliberations of which were held on July 19 and 20.

Representatives from various Bank departments make up the technical working groups and screening committees, who conducted table and field validations of entries and contenders to the LANDBANK client recognition programs. The following departments are: Development Assistance, Corporate Affairs, Environmental Program Management, Program Management I and II, Lending Operations Audit, and Credit Risk Management.

A farmer WORTH KNOWING

LANDBANK Gawad PITAK Ulirang Magsasaka 2018

ko ay isang magasasaka" — such a seemingly simple opening statement from someone accepting an award on a stage that is used to winners from all walks of life. Yet , these very words uttered with both humility and pride resonated strongly with the audience for they embody a movement in the agri industry that seeks to empower people hard at work to make a decent living in the countryside.

During his acceptance speech as the 2018 Ulirang Magsasaka under the special awards category of the Gawad sa Pinakatanging Kooperatiba or Gawad PITAK (see related story on page 9), Mr. Pacifico C. Cordada, Jr. shared with the audience a glimpse into his life as a farmer who has overcome great odds to become a successful leader and mentor to many in the town of T'boli in South Cotabato.

With a quiet effusiveness, he explained to the audience his gratitude toward how LANDBANK has helped him and other farmers to succeed.

Sa tulong ng LANDBANK, yung mga farmers namin noon na umaasa lang sa mga traders, ngayon nakabili na sila ng sarili nilang sasakyan para gagamitin sa kanilang mga produkto. At ako, ang masasabi ko, isa na ako sa natulungan ng LANDBANK.

Hindi pala hadlang ang kapansanan na umasenso ka kung nandyan ang LANDBANK.

Ang kapansanan ay hindi hadlang na makatulong sa bayan at sa mga katulad ko na farmers. Totoo pala ang sinasabi ng LANDBANK , we help you grow. Dahil sa bayan ng T'boli, ang mga farmers dun umasenso na dahil sa tulong ng LANDBANK.

Such help has given the Laconon 100 Multi-Purpose Cooperative, which Mr. Cordada currently chairs, the opportunity to successfully plant pineapples spanning over a 1,005 hectares, as well as provide close to 2,000 jobs. Additionally, the cooperative has helped get back an estimated 150 hectares of farmland accepted by traders as collateral from farmers.

He also shared how the Bank led him into a path of helping more people farm better. He reminds those in Laconon MPC to look for the really poor farmers to be helped by the cooperative, so that they can also know and experience what it means to be helped by LANDBANK.

A life LESS ORDINARY

For Pacifico Cordada Jr., living life with disability is what he has known almost his entire life, having been hit with polio at the young age of two. He grew up in the mountain side, raised by parents who are both farmers. Living far from the nearest hospital as well as being misdiagnosed by the local albularyo, his condition then wasn't given the proper medical attention.


Living with underdeveloped limbs (an arm and a leg), one would typically think this to be a cause for despair. But, for Pacifico, what happened to him at a young age has given him more drive in life. Even if he walks with crutches to get around, even in a wheelchair at times, he works just like any able-bodied person would at times, even harder.

Although he does not have a college degree to his name, his work as a public servant and private citizen has given him valuable credibility among his peers and the community. An inspiration to other persons with disabilities, he has the privilege of helping them lead better lives as president of the PWD federation in the municipality. A former municipal councilor, Mr. Cordada now chairs the Laconon 100 Multi-Purpose Cooperative.

His life as a farmer is no simple feat either. He oversees hectares of corn fields and manages his own pineapple farm located in Barangay New Dumagas in T'boli. These, along with a hog and cattle-raising business and a hauling truck and tractors operation, keep him a very busy and productive man.

The harvested pineapples from the combined efforts of his fellow farmers are deliverd to Dole Philippines in Polomolok.

Days after being named Ulirang Magsasaka, Pacifico and his fellow Gawad PITAK winners enjoyed a day at the Senate as they graced the Gawad PITAK exhibit opening staged by LANDBANK, thanks to the Office of Senator Juan Miguel Zubiri, this year's Chairman of the Gawad PITAK Board of Judges. More importantly, it was to witness the senator champion the cooperatives in front of other lawmakers, and pass several resolutions in their honor. (*Please see page 11 for related story.*)

he newly minted awardees of the Gawad PITAK 2018 attended the opening of an exhibit staged by LANDBANK in their honor on the second floor, main building of the Senate of the Philippines last August 14, 2018.

Along with other simultaneous activities that have been introduced in past years, such as the Mabuhay mud balls-making and PET bottle rescue boatmaking, this year saw the launch of the Ecobrick program, wherein PET bottles are packed tightly with clean and dry single-use plastic materials, and turned into building blocks for tables and chairs. Low-cost and sustainable, this endeavour is another way for the community to curb environmental pollution. A total of 3,474 quality-checked ecobricks, equivalent to about 800 kilograms of plastic wastes were produced by LANDBANK employees.

In fact, at www.GoBrik.com, a website for ecobricking communities, LANDBANK is recognized as the Top Ecobricking Community in the world since its first log last July 6, 2018. The collected ecobricks were assembled together during the event to form 110 eco-chairs, which will be donated to the Department of Social Welfare and Development for children's use at its Manila's Drop-in Center.

Another highlight of the program is the turnover of a portion of the proceeds from the Manila Bay Fun Run last July 15, 2018 organized by the Manila Broadcasting Company (MBC). The proceeds amounting to Php175,576.88 will further help MBSPPI fund its environment programs and campaigns.

MBSPPI is the flagship corporate social responsibility program of LANDBANK for the environment and consists of various members from the public and private sectors, with the goal of protecting and rehabilitating the Manila Bay. Since its inception in 2009, it has launched various efforts to promote the protection of waterways and information campaign on responsible waste disposal.

LINK.BIZPORTAL ADDS NEW PARTNERS

ANDBANK and Philippine Daily Inquirer (PDI) signed a Memorandum of Agreement last July 3, 2018 for the latter's enrolment to the Bank's Online Collection Facility for National Government Agencies (NGAs) and Link. BizPortal Facility.

> NGAs can now pay their obligations online to PDI, such as subscriptions and advertisements, through the Online Collection Facility via Auto-Debit Arrangement.

> > Retailers, on the other hand, can now avail of PDI's services and pay their requests, such as subscriptions, classified ads, and advertisements, through Link. BizPortal. Subscribers must have a LANDBANK ATM Account, Participating BancNet-Member Bank Card Account and GCash Account.

Cooperative Development Authority fees now available for online payment

ANDBANK recently signed a Memorandum of Agreement with the Cooperative Development Authority (CDA) for the online payment of various CDA fees and charges through LANDBANK Link. BizPortal, a 24/7 online payment facility that allows clients to pay for products and services of enrolled merchants both from the government and private sectors.

The CDA will utilize the LANDBANK Link. BizPortal for the collection of six fees, namely: Cooperative Name Registration, New Registration, Registration of Amendment, Registration of Branch/Satellite/ Laboratory, Forms, and Masterlist.

For the Cooperative Name Registration, applicants will need to register via the CDA website www.cda.gov.ph and fill out the required information. A reservation number will be generated which will then be used to verify if the request has been processed, and available for payment.

The LANDBANK Link.BizPortal is not limited to LANDBANK account holders. It is also made available to cooperatives maintaining accounts with participating BancNet-member banks and those using Globe G-Cash. LANDBANK and BancNet ATM cardholders must be enrolled in LANDBANK iAccess and BancNet Online, respectively, to be able to use the LANDBANK Link.BizPortal.
